They made me chief down at Puerto Rico, when I went down there, they made me, they first asked me if I wanted to accept a position as a United Indigenous Nations chief. And so, it took me four days. It didn't take very long. And people from Greenland, I was in Greenland one time during the war, and some of them told me up there when they mentioned my name, and they came over and wanted me to accept it at different places, different tribes. So, I said, okay, I'll accept it. And they were really happy when I said I was going to accept it.

And then that's when one of the lawyers or attorneys got up ahead of it, got up and told me, you're not standing alone. Chief, he said, we're from Norway, and there's 143 nations for you. So, you're not alone. So, don't be afraid to speak up. So, ever since then, they've been putting mugs in my ear as to what I could do. But I haven't really thrown myself out to people yet. Like I say, you put a little profile until they clamp down on us, and then we're going to speak out where we stand in the United States.
